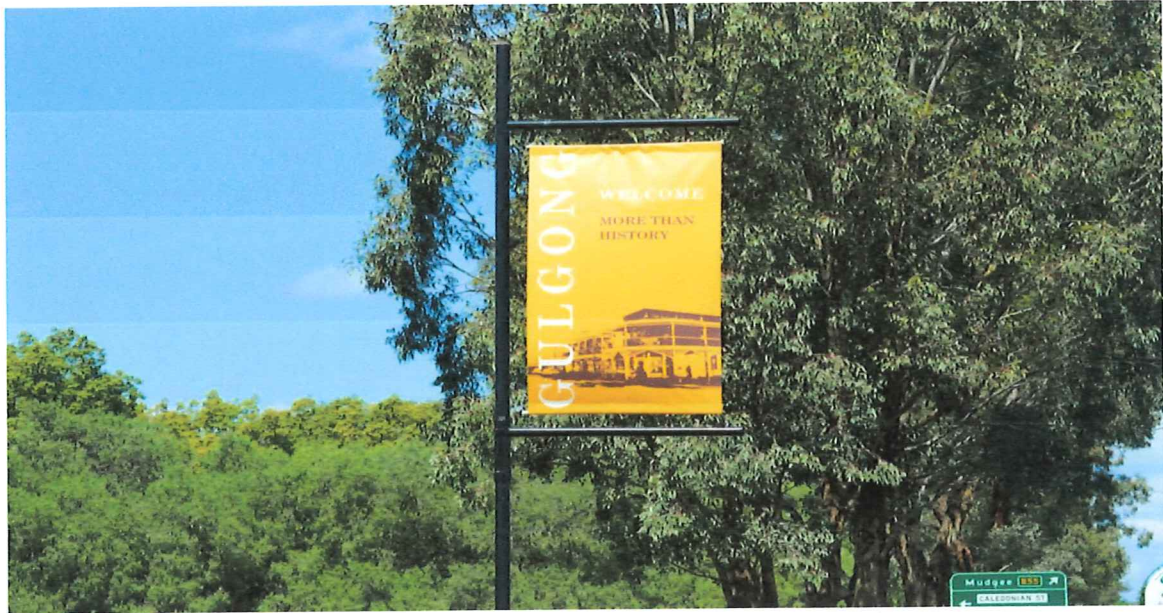




GULGONG



Many of us have not had any justification as to the protection of the term “HISTORIC GULGONG”

Gulgong is a 19th century gold rush town the first settlers arrived in the 1820's and was put on the map in the 1870's

Today much of this town remains contributing to its appeal as a tourist destination, even features on Australia's first ten dollar note

Gulgong is one of the few towns in NSW that has retained the magic of the gold rush days, and is now heritage listed.

Although the town began to dwindle as the gold rush moved further afield, much of what the people built and left behind still stands, and the town has been classified by the National Trust since 1975

Myself and many others of this town believe allowing a (MODERN) day large scale solar farm to be in only a few KS from such a historical and heritage filled town diminishes the authenticity of the term “HISTORIC GULGONG”.
