I am very worried for my Father's health if the proposed Hanson Concrete Plant and the Aggregate Handling Facility proposed for Glebe Island is allowed to proceed.

To think that he will be continually woken up at night by ships coming and going and the vibration from the ships' and tugs' propellers, which I know from first hand experience, resonates right through the building fills me with dread.
