Dear Sir/Madam

How many times do we need to say we don't want this mine? Why do we have to keep having more and more meetings, putting pressure on people to attend more meetings or write letters and again and again say the same thing? This has been going on for so long. The vast majority of submissions oppose this inappropriate proposal. Nothing has changed since I put in my objection last year and I say again:

**TOO CLOSE** - This mine is too close to our town, waterways and surrounding homes and residential estates.

**AIR POLLUTION** - There will be coal dust from the mine, there cannot be any denying of that. There is too much evidence to prove this is true. The dust will be constant from the daily operations and also from blasts. This dust will be all through our valley. It will make its way into our lungs when we breathe. Importantly, it will have health impacts on our children and the elderly .

**WATER POLLUTION** – The dust will make its way into our drinking water via our rivers, creeks and after settling on our roofs it will be washed into our rain water tanks.

**VISUAL POLLUTION** - There is the visual impact (both the mine and the barriers). Our beautiful landscape changed for ever – it cannot be put back.

**NOISE POLLUTION** - There will be noise pollution and if, once the mine has their foot in the door they request to increase their working hours (as happened with Stratford), there will be even more noise pollution

**LIGHT POLLUTION** – From the mining operations. Even if not in use, there will be lights and this carries for kilometres

**EMPLOYMENT** – any growth in employment that may be espoused will be negated by the death of our other thriving industries. (This argument was used As with the Stratford mine where workforce, which was exaggerated, did not bring monetary rewards as promised).

We currently have agriculture and a growing tourism industry which is bringing money directly into the town. These industries will be destroyed if this mine is allowed to go ahead. I love this town, valley and the community. This mine cannot be allowed to go ahead!
