On 20th Dec 2008, Council called the FORBESDALE residents to a meeting in Chambers to drop the ROCKY HILL Bombshell.

I cried all over Christmas and many times since as more lurid details have emerged.

Here am I sitting in an almost new large home into which I've sunk every penny I own as an investment for my old age ~~as~~ (I'm 80 on 4/12). Now my "investment" is worth \$200,000 to \$250,000 less than I paid for it AND I will be sitting 980 metres (approx) from an open cut coal face.
