Comments before and after project commencement:

Professor Richard Mackay was considered for appointment as chair of this project panel, subject to conflict of interest checks. However, before he was appointed to the Panel, Professor Mackay contacted the Commission on 12 November 2018 to disclose aspects including his involvement in the "Australian Technology Park Conservation Management Plan prepared by Godden Mackay Logan Pty Ptd", dated December 2013.

Professor Mackay sought additional information about the consultants involved in these projects and, having received that information, he confirmed that he had considered the relevant IPC 'Policy Guide' relating to conflicts of interest, including the matrix of possible conflicts of interest, and confirmed that he did not have a conflict of interest. He was not a consultant in relation to the subject projects; he also left GML as an employee and Partner in September 2015, which over two years ago (as per the Commission's policy).

On 13 November 2018, the Commission received an email from Ethos Urban, acting on behalf of the applicant, which considered the appointment of Professor Mackay to be against the Commission's Conflict of Interest Policy.

Notwithstanding the above, Professor Mackay stepped down from the Panel on 14 November 2018 in order to avoid any possible perception of any conflict of interest.

Chris Wilson was then considered for appointment as chair of this project panel. On receiving his nomination letter Chris responded that a colleague had made a submission to the Department regarding this project. Following discussions between Mr Wilson and the Chair of the Commission it was decided that due to the potential for a perceived conflict it was agreed that Mr Wilson would cease his role as chair of the Panel. John Hann was then appointed chair of the panel on 16 November 2018.

Following the Commission's site inspection with the applicant on 22 November 2018, a consultant assisting the Commission Secretariat with this project identified a perceived conflict of interest due to the proximity of the site to where the consultant lives. The consultant subsequently removed themselves from assisting the Commission Secretariat on 23 November 2018 and another consultant was appointed.
