Since Whitehaven has been in the region, I've seen the local region grow and develop. With some of Whitehaven's mines set to close in the coming years, it's important to get projects like Vickery approved so we can continue to see the area thrive.

Whitehaven has a very positive Indigenous Employment Program in place which has produced significant benefits for the local Indigenous communities. If the Vickery project was to be approved, it will generate 950 new jobs and ensure these critical employment programs can continue and provide long term benefits to the people and communities in the region.

The Vickery Extension Project will bring many benefits to the local region including Indigenous people in terms of job opportunities that they would not otherwise get and potentially fundamentally change their and their family's futures.

A major positivity in the community has been the return of residents who moved away to find work in across Australia. This has meant workers are reunited with family members and adding to community networks.

A diverse economy, especially at this time of drought, is essential to supporting not just miners but all the local businesses that rely on mining. If it weren't for mining, places like Gunnedah, Boggabri and Narrabri would be doing it a lot tougher.

The Vickery Extension Project will deliver millions in royalties to NSW, which is money for schools, hospitals and other essential public infrastructure and services.
