Please find listed below my objections to the wanted Narrabri gas Project.

1. In 2014 the NSW Chief Scientist stated CSG can be managed safely under strict conditions, but only 2 of her 16 recommendations have been implemented, meeting only 12.5% of the government's key requirements to protect communities is totally unacceptable and does not ensure our safety. Access to clean water, air and food is a human right that we need to protect our community and future generations.
2. The global gas market remains over-supplied, why are we continuously being told there is a shortage when we are the biggest exporter of gas in the world.
3. From June 2020 major insurance companies will no longer include liability protection in insurance policies to landowners if CSG operates on their land.

Australia won't be the world's most valuable beef and grain exporter if our cattle, sheep and crop are contaminated, why would we risk the jobs and income the ag industry supports when not all the horses have been ticked yet. Santos still have not said how they will dispose of the toxic waste water & toxic salt which will be produced from underground during production.

Over 20 years Santos will remove 37.5 billion litres of water from deep below the Pilliga, removing this water will cause desiccation and loss of water in the Pilliga Sandstone, the southern recharge of the Great Artesian Basin. Hundreds of horses have already been affected in Queensland and hundreds more will be impacted in the years to come. This includes town water supply lines:- without this water how can our rural communities exist.
6. Etched in my mind is a video of a community in Queensland surrounded by gas fields, such devastation was caused in that area. I pray you will not allow this to happen anywhere else in our beautiful country of Australia.
