When I lived at Wathella cut on the Coonamble Road a bird count was done and they got to 120 species.

We can hike along through our forest and we see Koalas, Possums, Wallabies, Echidnas and all kinds of snakes and lizards.

In the middle of the scrub there is a firetower at the old salt caves. When you climb up you have a view in every direction, as far as the eye can see and it is entirely bush. I can't climb it now because of Arthrosis but I always enjoy the memories.

Our Bone Brook is a great benefit for people with Arthritis or injuries. Everyone knows how good the Anterior hot water is and many travellers return many times.

Sometimes you can barely get a car park. We don't have a town pool so most of our kids

learn to swim in the bore and it is always busy with local families playing and having B.B.Q.s,

I have rainwater for drinking. But like everyone else I count on the bore water for my garden all washing and animals.

We need it for fire fighting too of course

About 5 years ago. Santos tried to sponsor our community centre. Our community knocked them back because of the problems they will give over Willoga and Burns

I have already been poisoned when an aerial crop duster sprayed us when we were cotton harvesting.

It was a life changing event as it really knocked my health around.

Merle put up with enough poison without coal seam gas adding to it.

We noticed, merle all noticed, the Summers are getting hotter and the Winters are getting shorter and warmer

The heat is intensifying and it is harder to keep even heat tolerant plants alive

I've worked as a shearer, cook a driver and help on other hard jobs and I know what heat feels like

A couple of years ago an old man was walking past my yard and stopped to talk to me. He'd seen all the NOCSB Yellow Signs around Willoga and was shocked and sad to realise the gas industry was coming here.

The poor man had left Q.L.D. for a holiday and was camped at the bore.

He started crying because he'd had friends suicide over the pressure of the gas disputes over their land around Chinchilla.

We know jobs are important but they need to be healthy and life improving, not causing damage for our poor little kids to deal with. Please help no
