I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

The Pilliga forest, surrounding farmland and water is important future generations and CSG risks to our climate are unacceptable. There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

To the Independent Planning Commission,

My name and submission may be included on your website.

I strongly object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts. The Santos company is seeking approval to drill up to 850 coal seam gas wells at 425 sites in and around the Pilliga state forest near Narrabri covering an area of about 1,000 hectares.

The Pilliga forest, farmland and water is vital to protect. The minerals, oil and natural gas industries are major greenhouse gas emitters. To put this region at risk will be yet another scenario negatively impacting climate. The Independent Planning Commission, in its role of final decision makers, must respond to the gravity of the situation by rejecting the Narrabri Gas Project.

Whilst the Project will use best practice environmental management principles and practices, major events do occur which impact the environment. As well, there are long-term potential environmental impacts after mine closure, such as aquifer contamination, reduced options for land use, and the larger-scale landscape impacts in the Pilbara region. The annual cost of managing acid drainage after mine closure increases fivefold to hundreds of millions of dollars. This is of particular concern with coal seam gas where there is the potential for contamination and acidification of aquifers and surface waters.

Coonamble farmer Anne Kennedy was quoted In the Northern Daily Leader newspaper:

“Experts have reviewed Santos’ Environmental Impact Statement and found that this project presents profound risk to the recharge of the Great Artesian Basin,” Ms Kennedy said.

“The Pilliga Sandstone is effectively the headwater of the aquifer we rely on for our existence and Santos want to drill straight through it and depressure the aquifers below it.”

Mining also involves putting the public at risk of health impacts such as elevated lead blood levels (from air pollution from metal smelting at Port Pirie, South Australia) and cancer clusters in the Upper Hunter Valley.

The project area is covered by the Gomeroi People's Native Title Claim. Most mining operations in remote Australia are required to have community development and involvement programs involving Indigenous people. However these are generally difficult to achieve, given deep cultural differences and diversity in the level of support for mining within some indigenous communities. 90 identified Aboriginal cultural heritage sites are at risk. Gomeroi woman Donna Kenny regularly visits a site where 10,000 litres of contaminated water leaked into the Pilliga State Forest in 2011, to check on the progress of the remediation. Six years on from the spill, she is dismayed at the devastation. "It's an attempt but I don't think it's working, I don't think you can rehabilitate what's dead," Ms Kenny told the ABC.

The company said the project area did not contain strategic agriculture land as mapped by the NSW Government (<https://www.abc.net.au/news/2017-02-01/santos-narrabri-csg-eis-lodged-residents-horrified/8228996>). However, farmers Sarah and Matthew Ciesiolka produce 50 million potatoes and 1 million kilograms of peanuts on a property 6km from the proposed Narrabri Gas project. Kerry and Brian Hanigan have been on their farm 80 kilometres from Coonamble for the past 30 years. Steve Eather, 65, is a farmer from Boggabri near Narrabri. He's a third generation farmer. Retired marine engineer Tony Pickard purchased his small sheep farm seeking a tree change. Farmer Peter Gett grows cereals and runs cattle on this property just outside Narrabri. (<https://www.abc.net.au/news/2017-04-07/nsw-town-divided-over-coal-seam-gas-proposal/8423394>). These are some of the people in agriculture despite Santos' statement that the region did not contain 'strategic agriculture land'.

With increasing levels of overseas ownership and management, there is a risk that less regard for the Australian economy, environment and community will be made in the setting of the company's international objectives and priorities.

18,000 objections to this project were submitted. It is the largest number of submissions the NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) has ever received on a development application. The Independent Planning Commission should recognise that this number of individuals and groups indicate the high level of concern in the Australian community at large to this project.

As parents to three and grandparents to four little girls, considering the risks to their environment and their climate by Santos' proposal, I urge you to look ahead to *their* world and what we will leave them.

Due to the scientific concerns over the Pilbara environment, harmful knock-on effects on climate, unsafe health and harmful cultural effects on the Indigenous community, the enormous ongoing maintenance costs after mine closure and the impact on the area's agriculture and farming, I strongly object to the Narrabri Gas Project. Please put a stop to this.

I am writing to ask you to reject the proposed Vickery Extension Project near Boggabri.

If this mine goes ahead, it will have unacceptable impacts on the local farming community, the agriculture and water resources of the Namoi Valley, the region's rich cultural heritage and the liveable climate that we all rely upon.

The Boggabri district is already reeling from the depopulation of farms by Whitehaven's nearby Maules Creek coal mine. Whitehaven has acquired more than 61,050 ha of land over 471 freehold titles in the district.

At least 90 FAMILY FARMS HAVE BEEN BOUGHT OUT, WITH MANY LEAVING the region permanently. This farming community will not survive with another coal mine in the region.

The IMPACTS ON WATER will be severe. Even the Department of Planning admits the new Vickery mine might run out of water in dry times.

The mine will leave a vast pile of mine waste on top of the Namoi alluvial aquifer, which could result in heavy metals leaching into the aquifer, according to water experts from the NSW Government.

We cannot risk the limited water resources of the Namoi Valley, and the agriculture it supports, with another water hungry coal mine.

Other negative impacts of the mine include:

- It will add 370 million tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions to the atmosphere, putting all Australians at risk of extreme weather and dangerous fires.
- Mine infrastructure will encroach within 300 metres of the historic 'Kurrumbede' homestead. Mine dust and blasting could put the structural integrity of the homestead at risk.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

The recent destruction of ancient Indigenous caves in WA by another mining company should be reason enough to prevent this proposed project from going ahead.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Santos proposes to drill 850 CSG wells through the recharge zone of the Great Artesian Basin in the Pilliga forests, the largest remaining woodland wilderness in NSW.

Environment

The project will criss-cross the Pilliga forest with roads and pipelines, and threaten underground water supplies vital for farming. This project will tear through a forest that is a priority area for koala conservation and home to two rare, iconic and critically endangered bird species — the swift parrot and the regent honeyeater.

The Pilliga forest protect a particularly important population of the Barking Owl. It is also home to many threatened mammals including the Koala, Squirrel Glider, Blacked-striped Wallaby, Corben's Long-eared Bat and the endemic Pilliga Mouse. It is also home to two rare, iconic and critically endangered bird species — the swift parrot and the regent honeyeater. Australia has the fastest rate of extinction of mammals on earth. Koalas are predicted to become extinct by 2050.

This project will remove 1.5 gigalitres of water each year from the Great Artesian Basin, threatening ecosystems and the water supply of local farmers who rely on it for stock and crops.

On the driest inhabited continent on earth our water is precious and I am deeply concerned that water, soil, ecosystems, farmers and indigenous sites will be and have already been put at risk by testing and drilling. Our water is at risk of being irreversibly poisoned.

Exploration drilling by Santos has already left farmers with toxic water and promises to supply water have not been kept. How devastating would it be to have the water on your land poisoned?

Our farmland and our precious ecosystems must be sustainably managed for the future. Clean water is life. It is not ok to poison any water or put anyone else at risk or destroy our ecosystems or aboriginal heritage.

The Community

The project is controversial with widespread community and political opposition. In ongoing community surveys 97% of landowners covering 3.2 million hectares surrounding the Pilliga say 'no' to CSG.

Aboriginal Heritage

Despite years of negotiations, no Indigenous Land Use Agreements have been signed. Santos proposes to undertake detailed surveys after it gets approval and avoid newly found sites of high significance – a highly risky strategy – once granted, the approval will not be able to be revoked.

Santos' approach fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

We already have left a huge environmental debt for future generations - we have ignored the land management practices of the Aboriginal people who for thousands of years cared for and understood this land.

NSW Government's Responsibilities

An article by Anne Davies in The Guardian on 27 Feb 2020 headed 'Scathing Report into NSW Coal Seam Gas Could Create New Hurdles for Santos Narrabri Project' states:

'A parliamentary inquiry has found the NSW government failed to fully implement 14 of 16 recommendations regarding coal seam gas, increasing the likelihood of a moratorium across the state.'

Santos's coal seam gas project near Narrabri could face further obstacles after a parliamentary inquiry delivered a scathing assessment of the state government's progress in implementing recommendations to regulate coal seam gas extraction.

A New South Wales legislative council inquiry found that 14 of 16 recommendations from the 2014 report by the chief scientist have not been implemented in full. Half were found to have not been implemented at all.

This included recommendations for a world-class single regulatory regime for CSG extraction in NSW, developing an environmental data portal, making the Environmental Protection Agency the lead regulator of the industry, developing clear rules on access to farmers' land and rules around compensation, and developing a system to consult with communities.'

The Climate

After three years of record drought and unprecedented bushfires, climate change is at the forefront of everyone's minds.

To think that our government would even contemplate supporting, let alone approving, a project that puts our only secure water supply at risk is unbelievable.

Australia has just been through catastrophic drought and bushfires. The science has been telling us that if we wish to mitigate extreme weather events that are already impacting us all right now, no new fossil fuel basins can be opened.

'The presence of permanently lit gas flares in the Pilliga forests as part of the proposed Santos gas project in the state's north west are "like a loaded gun pointed at us all summer", farmer Mal Donaldson told a hearing into the development yesterday.

"Santos' complacency (about fire risk) would be laughable if it wasn't so bloody serious," he said.

Mr Donaldson is a rural Fire Service volunteer. He was one of almost 70 speakers -many of them local farmers and residents – to address the fifth day of hearings held by the NSW Independent Planning Committee into the Narrabri Gas Project.

While on Thursday the committee heard expert objections to the project, which would drill 850 wells to extract coal seam gas, yesterday many spoke in personal terms about their concerns about increased bushfire hazard, damage to groundwater systems and leaks of the estimated 35 billion litres of saline water the project would produce.

Some wept as they spoke and several voiced fears for the wellbeing of their children and grandchildren due to climate change and local environmental degradation.

"We come to you as real people speaking for our native flora and fauna in the Pilliga, we come to you as real people speaking for our precious Great Artesian Basin and our only source of fresh water," farmer Rowena Macrae said. "We come to you as farmers, business owners, community members and everyday down-to-earth Aussies who just want to get on with living life without this huge threat hanging over us each and every day."

The Pilliga forest, surrounding farmland and water is important to all of us and the risks to our climate are unacceptable for the future of my children and grand children who live in NSW.

Here are the main reasons why I object to this project.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. 35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This

could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not "adversely affect groundwater" however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater”; however, Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. In that context I find this conclusion difficult to accept. While many physics experiments can be repeated, geophysics ones generally cannot. As a Concerned Australian I see too many projects like these being undertaken at the cost of the local and global environment.

Our Children and Grandchildren deserve a better place to grow up in, not a worse one.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW and Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of it, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

I understand 35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby.

It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime, so the project should not be approved on those grounds alone.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and First Nations People's consent has not been obtained. Santos proposing to site its facilities to avoid "areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups" shows it does not understand the wider scale Connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to local Gamilaraay culture.

I think NSW does not need more gas resources, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. That project could access cheap international gas and price Narrabri out of the market. I read an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics which states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

And of course gas usage adds to dangerous climate change.

The Assessment Report mentions the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) notes production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country! Estimates to supply major domestic markets are as high as \$9-10/GJ. I believe Australian customers seeking long term contracts for gas are paying \$9-12/GJ to secure gas supply, leaving little room for Narrabri profit. It will clearly be globally uncompetitive price for gas sales.

Lack of an adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project is a problem! It seems 117 tonnes (two B-double trucks) of salt waste have to be removed every day during peak production. The proposal to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate, since a capacity evaluation of the landfill has not been undertaken. In time salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems, too, so that's unacceptable.

The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be “critical for energy reliability and security” we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia

customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse effect.

There are many points and scientific reports that indicate that this project is not in the best interest of Australians in general and locals in particular. Local people who have to live with your decisions must be of particular concern for you. Money making foreign companies have a habit of taking and giving nothing back to local communities.

Of particular concern:

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not "adversely affect groundwater" however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

I am writing to ask you to reject the proposed Vickery Extension Project near Boggabri.

If this mine goes ahead, it will have unacceptable impacts on the local farming community, the agriculture and water resources of the Namoi Valley, the region's rich cultural heritage and the liveable climate that we all rely upon.

The Boggabri district is already reeling from the depopulation of farms by Whitehaven's nearby Maules Creek coal mine. Whitehaven has acquired more than 61,050 ha of land over 471 freehold titles in the district.

At least 90 family farms have been bought out, with many leaving the region permanently. This farming community will not survive with another coal mine in the region.

The impacts on water will be severe. Even the Department of Planning admits the new Vickery mine might run out of water in dry times.

The mine will leave a vast pile of mine waste on top of the Namoi alluvial aquifer, which could result in heavy metals leaching into the aquifer, according to water experts from the NSW Government.

We cannot risk the limited water resources of the Namoi Valley, and the agriculture it supports, with another water hungry coal mine.

Other negative impacts of the mine include:

- It will add 370 million tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions to the atmosphere, putting all Australians at risk of extreme weather and dangerous fires.
- Mine infrastructure will encroach within 300 metres of the historic 'Kurrumbede' homestead. Mine dust and blasting could put the structural integrity of the homestead at risk.

Having watched the Australian gas industry grow over the last ten years, I am amazed at the way politicians have grovelled at the feet of overseas gas companies. These multinational gas companies care not one iota about our beautiful land or the the Australian people, they only care about profits! Profits that go untaxed out of Australia.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act. . Use personal observations, scientific studies,

I am writing to make a submission on the Narrabri Gas Project.

I am happy for my name and submission to be included on your website.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project and ask the Independent Planning Commission to reject this project. My concerns are listed below.

Climate impact

If we are to have any hope of keeping global warming below 2°C we must keep gas in the ground.

This gas field will release at least 94.2 million tonnes of potent climate pollution during mining and when the gas is burned for energy, and fugitive methane emissions are likely to be underestimated.

Existing coal and gas fields will push the world past globally agreed temperature goals. There is no room, or need, for more. The rapid development of battery storage technology makes renewable energy sources backed by batteries a cheaper, cleaner option than developing more gas.

New gas production is an unnecessary and dangerous step in Australia's efforts to tackle climate change. Australia is highly vulnerable to climate change impacts like bushfires, drought and extreme heat. More gas extraction increases our exposure to climate risks.

Threatened species

This project will endanger koalas and two rare and iconic bird species - the swift parrot and the regent honeyeater.

The swift parrot is critically endangered. The total swift parrot population is estimated to be no more than 1000 pairs. Habitat loss is a contributing factor in the decline of this species.

The regent honeyeater has become an icon for birdwatchers in NSW. It is a threatened woodland species whose conservation will benefit a large suite of other threatened and declining woodland fauna.

There have been koala sightings in the Pilliga East State Forest. The Western Woodlands Alliance classifies that state forest as a priority area for koala conservation. Koala skulls have been discovered in the project area, further evidence of their presence.

Poison and deplete groundwater

Santos will remove 1.5 gigalitres of water per year by drilling 850 wells through the Pilliga sandstone aquifer (part of the Great Artesian Basin) and into the coal seams beneath.

This removal will depressurise the underground water sources, as well as threaten the recharge of the Great Artesian Basin that they feed.

This project will bring ancient, contaminated coal seam water to the surface.

The water from the coal seams has been in contact with coal for hundreds of thousands of years — perhaps longer — and has absorbed elements that could be harmful if they leak into the irrigation water in the aquifers. Extracted water from the coal seams may contaminate the Great Artesian Basin aquifer. Local communities rely on this supply for water for stock, domestic and irrigation purposes.

No need for more gas

Almost all gas produced in eastern Australia is exported via the LNG terminals at Gladstone. The small amount of expensively produced gas from the project will have negligible impact on domestic prices or supply.

This gas field will release at least 94.2 million tonnes of potent climate pollution during mining and when the gas is burned for energy, and fugitive methane emissions are likely to be underestimated.

Existing coal and gas fields will push the world past globally agreed temperature goals. There is no room, or need, for more. The rapid development of battery storage technology makes renewable energy sources backed by batteries a cheaper, cleaner option than developing more gas.

New gas production is an unnecessary and dangerous step in Australia's efforts to tackle climate change. Australia is highly vulnerable to climate change impacts like bushfires, drought and extreme heat. More gas extraction increases our exposure to climate risks.

Threatened species

This project will endanger koalas and two rare and iconic bird species - the swift parrot and the regent honeyeater.

The swift parrot is critically endangered. The total swift parrot population is estimated to be no more than 1000 pairs. Habitat loss is a contributing factor in the decline of this species.

The regent honeyeater has become an icon for birdwatchers in NSW. It is a threatened woodland species whose conservation will benefit a large suite of other threatened and declining woodland fauna.

There have been koala sightings in the Pilliga East State Forest. The Western Woodlands Alliance classifies that state forest as a priority area for koala conservation. Koala skulls have been discovered in the project area, further evidence of their presence.

Poison and deplete groundwater

Santos will remove 1.5 gigalitres of water per year by drilling 850 wells through the Pilliga sandstone aquifer (part of the Great Artesian Basin) and into the coal seams beneath.

This removal will depressurise the underground water sources, as well as threaten the recharge of the Great Artesian Basin that they feed.

This project will bring ancient, contaminated coal seam water to the surface.

The water from the coal seams has been in contact with coal for hundreds of thousands of years — perhaps longer — and has absorbed elements that could be harmful if they leak into the irrigation water in the aquifers. Extracted water from the coal seams may contaminate the Great Artesian Basin aquifer. Local communities rely on this supply for water for stock, domestic and irrigation purposes.

No need for more gas

Almost all gas produced in eastern Australia is exported via the LNG terminals at Gladstone. The small amount of expensively produced gas from the project will have negligible impact on domestic prices or supply.

In order to actually protect Australian businesses and households from gas supply shortages, governments should help them to get off gas by promoting electrification, such as heat pumps for hot water, reverse-cycle air conditioning for space heating and induction cooktops.

For these reasons I strongly object to the Narrabri Gas Project. Thank you for the opportunity to comment. I look forward to hearing from you in regards to this submission.

After treatment at the Leewood water treatment facility, many tonnes of solid salt, laced with heavy metals, will contaminate this water. Santos still has no disposal plan for these contaminants. The removal of this large amount of water will cause depressurisation and loss of water in the Pilliga Sandstone, the southern recharge of the Great Artesian Basin, which outcrops in the Pilliga.

Santos has used the most basic level of groundwater model because of how little is known about the deep aquifers they will dewater to extract gas.

Santos anticipates leakage from the precious alluvium that lies above the coal seams despite claiming there is no linkage between the water sources.

There will be severe effects on the viability of the land for farming, and therefore on the livelihoods of the landowners. This is important to me - these are my fellow citizens, and I feel their despair in the situation they are in.

Our country needs to promote renewable energy resources, not gas which will not be long-lasting; however the damaging effects on our environment and climate will be.

I have not expanded on the other damaging effects I believe will occur, but the environment, social and water damage lay heavily on my mind.

I first saw the Pilliga nearly 50 years ago as a newly arrived immigrant. This was a prime reason for coming to Australia, beautiful pristine forest, Indigenous people who cared for their ancient land. We must not destroy it.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

I want my new granddaughter to be able to experience the Pilliga as I have done.

The Pilliga forest covers 500,000 hectares of rare intact temperate woodland. 'Unlike other continents, Australia's most pressing environmental threats are not to tropical rain or temperate forests but to temperate woodlands, temperate grasslands, mallee and heath' (Lindenmayer, D. 2007 On Borrowed Time). Professor Lindenmayer also states that, 'Almost one third of the threatened ecological communities listed under the Federal Government's EPBC Act 1999 are woodlands.

Thirty five listed threatened animals rely on the Pilliga for survival, including the endemic Pilliga mouse. It is listed as vulnerable by the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (www.environment.nsw.gov.au/threatenedspeciesapp/profile.aspx?id=10690).

I believe the intrusion on the Pilliga woodland by many gas wells, roads, pipelines, compressor stations, wastewater dams and other infrastructure is unacceptable.

I am concerned that coal-seam gas extraction will have adverse effects on underground water quality due to the nature of the drilling process. Also, 'It is made up primarily of methane gas - 95-97% (www.lockthegate.org.au). Methane gas is 28 times more potent as a greenhouse gas than carbon dioxide at warming the earth on a 100-year timescale, and more than 80 times more potent over 20 years (www.nationalgeographic.com/environment/global-warming/methane/). Given this, Australia should be striving to install more (cheaper) renewable energy to meet its target of 26-28% by 2030 (below 2005 levels).

Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission regarding the Narrabri Gas Project.

I object the proposed project due to it's significant environmental, social and heritage impacts.

Firstly, I am concerned that this project EIS does not indicate where the development of gas wells will occur. This is extremely concerning and does not allow for a proper environmental assessment of the projects impacts.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. It is a critical habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater, and for koalas and the Pilliga Mouse which lives nowhere else in the world. Put simply, this ecosystem is not suitable to become an industrial gas-field. Without a detailed location plan for gas wells, an ecological impact assessment cannot be completed. This alone should be grounds for refusal.

The impacts on groundwater and the Great Artesian Basin are also concerning. Proposing to remove 37.5GL of groundwater over the life of the gasfield in an area which is apart of the Great Artesian Basin recharge is not an acceptable outcome.

This project will have no impact on lowering gas prices in the east coast gas market. It will constitute just 4.9% of gas exports at Gladstone and analysis by AGL shows it will be more expensive than existing gas supplies due to the expensive nature of GSG extraction.

The Climate Change impacts of this project are also extremely concerning. New research is showing that when the fugitive emissions from gas and GSG production are included, gas is no better or worse in terms of emissions than coal-fired generators. The UNEP's Production Gap Report indicates that we are on track to produce between 40 and 50% more oil and gas than would be consistent with a 2 degrees pathway by 2050. This implies that some gas reserves must be left in the ground. This should start with projects such as the Narrabri Gas Project where there is already significant local ecological and social impacts, and little economic gain.

Australians are blessed with more sun and wind than many other countries and wonderful flora and fauna that can't be found anywhere else and this gas project puts it all at risk. This project maybe centred around Narrabri but it impacts the rest of Australia including the Pilliga forest and surrounding farmland and water. It is important that nothing is allowed to risk our water supply and our climate whereby the next generation cannot enjoy the current benefits we have.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not "adversely affect groundwater" however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance

potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

The Narrabri Gas Project runs a great risk of polluting Australia's largest groundwater aquifer, the Great Artesian Basin. Any risk to our aquifers is unacceptable, and given the unpredictable outcome of the technologies used to extract gas, a proper risk-benefit analysis cannot be accurately performed. The Murray-Darling Basin is similarly vulnerable to contamination from drilling fluid spills and the salty treated water that the wells will produce.

The Gamilaraay Traditional Custodians have told Santos they do not want their country sacrificed for this coal seam gas project.

They are concerned about the hundreds of cultural sites, and song lines and stories connecting their people to the forest. Gamilaraay people are deeply opposed to this project, and do not want their country sacrificed for this project. They are in the frontline of the battle against Santos and this coal seam gas.

Local farmers do not want the project to go ahead. Community surveys show approximately 97% opposition to this coal seam gas project. Hundreds of farmers have participated in protest actions unlike any previously seen in the region. Farmers and traditional custodians are united in their opposition to this project because they see the irreversible environmental degradation it will cause, destroying their livelihoods and causing moral injury, because they can see it will only damage the community, the environment, and all the species that rely on it, and bring no gain. Santos, on the other hand will make money.

Environmental Destruction

Santos cannot be trusted to manage the project safely, as the Narrabri Gas Project has a long history of spills and leaks of toxic water. This technology cannot be safely employed, and should not be used in Australia. Several disastrous coal seam gas projects in the USA, such as Pavillion, Wyoming, provide all the information we need to ascertain that we do not want to risk similar outcomes in Australia.

Santos has already contaminated a freshwater aquifer in the Pilliga with uranium at levels 20 times higher than safe drinking water guidelines, as well as lead, aluminium, arsenic and barium. In addition, there have been more than 20 reported spills and leaks of toxic coal seam gas water from storage ponds, pipes and well heads. Other environmental disasters that Santos is responsible for include the 2004 Moomba explosion, Port Bonython groundwater contamination in 2008, and the Jackson oil spill in Queensland in 2013. There have been numerous others. The point here is that there is no safe way of bringing these projects to fruition. Drilling into the earth is inherently dangerous and destructive to the environment and its inhabitants.

Coal seam gas fields are dangerous to people, and especially to children. Various hydrocarbons and volatile organic compounds are released into the air from coal seam gas operations. Health hazards include eye, nose and airway irritation, headache, nausea, dizziness and loss of coordination and have been documented in populations near to gas fields in Queensland, Sydney, and all across America.

The Pilliga is prone to severe bush fires, and this Santos gas field would increase fire risk throughout the Pilliga's tinder-box conditions, as methane flares up to 50m high would be burning day and night, even on total fire ban days.

The Pilliga is a nationally listed 'biodiversity hotspots'. It is vital to over 200 bird species, and also to the survival of threatened species like the Koala, Spotted-tailed Quoll, Black-striped Wallaby, Eastern Pygmy-possum, Pilliga Mouse and South-eastern Long-eared Bat. The gas field proposed by Santos would fragment 95,000 hectares of the Pilliga with well pads, roads, and water and gas pipelines, damaging vital habitat and threatening endangered species with extinction.

Santos has no solution for disposing of the hundreds of thousands of tonnes of salt that will be produced by coal seam gas mining. This industry would leave a toxic legacy of salt waste in NSW.

Coal seam gas fuels climate change, as methane is the major component of natural gas. Methane is a greenhouse gas 72 times more powerful than CO₂. Coal seam gas fields demonstrably contribute to climate change through the leakage of methane during the production, transport, processing and use of coal seam gas.

The operation of the Siding Springs Observatory, situated in the Warrumbungles and adjacent to the Pilliga, will be compromised by light and dust pollution if the Government approves the Narrabri Gas Project.

The viability of Siding Springs, our nation's most important optical astronomical observatory, is under threat from the Narrabri Gas Project due to light and dust pollution, and proposed 50m high gas flares.

It is unconscionable that the Government would choose to approve this project in spite of the documented risks, especially at a time when the world is moving toward renewables, and the options to provide power in cleaner ways have never been more numerous.

I find myself, an ordinary citizen of Australia, resident in Sydney, profoundly depressed by the rate at which the NSW and federal governments are seeking to exploit the natural resources of our country without taking account of whether the huge environmental cost of this exploitation balances with the public value of the resource. The only "value" taken into account seems to be that derived by the resource company seeking permission. I read that all these requests for access to our natural resources come with strong environmental regulations designed to protect wildlife, landscape, waterways and sites of cultural significance but after decades of reading about the devastation of wildlife and water caused by a wide variety of activities and companies reading that Rio Tinto knowingly blew up a 45,000 year old site in the Pilbara to expand an existing mine I have no confidence that any company will abide by the regulations attached to their approval.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

I'm a concerned citizen who doesn't agree with needless disruption to the home of endangered species. I see Santos' proposed coal seam gas wells as unnecessary since we don't have a gas shortage; the NSW Government has approved a plan to almost double the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. Gas = climate change; if we do need more electricity it should be coming from renewable sources e.g. wind and solar.

Santos proposes clearing approx. 2471 acres of the Pilliga incl. habitat for the critically endangered woodland bird; the Regent honeyeater and for koalas who've already lost 30% of their habitat due to the recent NSW bush fires.

Threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival incl. the Squirrel Glider, Pilliga Mouse and Black striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a home for threatened birds e.g. the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Assessment Report says "the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region." But the report doesn't take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and negatively affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no surveys to measure the population of the Pilliga Mouse. Approving these coal seam wells would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The Pilliga forest, surrounding farmland and water is important to not just me but to all Australians and our ecosystem. The risks to our climate are unacceptable and even though I don't have any children I am concerned about how we act and what we will leave for the future generations. We should all aim at leaving this world a better place than we found it.

We can not allow the unacceptable and inherent risks to the environment including the water supplies, that accompany Santos' plan to plunder 850 coal seam gas (CSG) wells through the recharge zone of the Great Artesian Basin in the precious Pilliga forest would cause.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding "areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups" fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

The Assessment Report states "the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region." However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

For this reason the precautionary principle should be adopted and the Narrabri Gas Project should not proceed.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

I am a concerned citizen who loves Australia and it's natural wonders, it's wondrous forests, plant and animals. The Pilliga forest sits on the sacred land of the Gamilaraay people. It has been long recognised as one of the most important areas for biodiversity in eastern Australia, home to at least 300 native animal species and over 900 plant species. It is a vast western woodland characterised by native white cypress and ironbark forests, broom bush plants and vivid spring flowers. Thirty-five listed threatened animals rely on the Pilliga for survival - including the endemic Pilliga mouse, squirrel glider and Spotted-tail quoll. The forest also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

Please do not allow this beautiful land to be destroyed for future generations. As a mother, I want my children and grandchildren to be able to experience this amazing environment and be proud that I made a stand to try and stop it being destroyed by CSG companies wanting to rape the environment for monetary gain.

Santos' plan to plunder 850 coal seam gas (CSG) wells through the recharge zone of the Great Artesian Basin in the precious Pilliga forest would destroy this fragile ecosystem and this is not acceptable.

Some of my reasons are as follows:

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequently increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

The infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed. After the horrendous bush fires last summer, we cannot afford to lose any more of our bushland and risk it to bushfires.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

I am writing to ask you to reject the proposed Vickery Extension Project near Boggabri.

If this mine goes ahead, it will have unacceptable impacts on the local farming community, the agriculture and water resources of the Namoi Valley, the region's rich cultural heritage and the liveable climate that we all rely upon.

The Boggabri district is already reeling from the depopulation of farms by Whitehaven's nearby Maules Creek coal mine. Whitehaven has acquired more than 61,050 ha of land over 471 freehold titles in the district.

At least 90 family farms have been bought out, with many leaving the region permanently. This farming community will not survive with another coal mine in the region.

The impacts on water will be severe. Even the Department of Planning admits the new Vickery mine might run out of water in dry times.

The mine will leave a vast pile of mine waste on top of the Namoi alluvial aquifer, which could result in heavy metals leaching into the aquifer, according to water experts from the NSW Government.

We cannot risk the limited water resources of the Namoi Valley, and the agriculture it supports, with another water hungry coal mine.

Other negative impacts of the mine include:

- It will add 370 million tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions to the atmosphere, putting all Australians at risk of extreme weather and dangerous fires.
- Mine infrastructure will encroach within 300 metres of the historic 'Kurrumbede' homestead. Mine dust and blasting could put the structural integrity of the homestead at risk.

My name is Rebecca Miller and I live in NSW. I am making this submission because I care about my country and the people who live here. The Pilliga forest is sacred land to the Gamilaraay people and 97% of the local community say NO to Pilliga CSG.

I also have many objections to this project including the following:

1. Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

2. 35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo. Furthermore, the Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

3. Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

4. NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

5. The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW .

Waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems. boriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained.

The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia

customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

The Pilliga forest covers half a million hectares of rare intact temperate eucalypt woodland full of life, richness and wonder. Thirty five listed threatened animals rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga mouse, squirrel glider and Spotted-tail quoll. The forest also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project and ask the Independent Planning Commission to reject this project. My concerns are listed below.

Climate impact

If we are to have any hope of keeping global warming below 2°C we must keep gas in the ground.

This gas field will release at least 94.2 million tonnes of potent climate pollution during mining and when the gas is burned for energy, and fugitive methane emissions are likely to be underestimated.

Existing coal and gas fields will push the world past globally agreed temperature goals. There is no room, or need, for more. The rapid development of battery storage technology makes renewable energy sources backed by batteries a cheaper, cleaner option than developing more gas.

New gas production is an unnecessary and dangerous step in Australia's efforts to tackle climate change. Australia is highly vulnerable to climate change impacts like bushfires, drought and extreme heat. More gas extraction increases our exposure to climate risks.

Threatened species

This project will endanger koalas and two rare and iconic bird species - the swift parrot and the regent honeyeater.

The swift parrot is critically endangered. The total swift parrot population is estimated to be no more than 1000 pairs. Habitat loss is a contributing factor in the decline of this species.

The regent honeyeater has become an icon for birdwatchers in NSW. It is a threatened woodland species whose conservation will benefit a large suite of other threatened and declining woodland fauna.

There have been koala sightings in the Pilliga East State Forest. The Western Woodlands Alliance classifies that state forest as a priority area for koala conservation. Koala skulls have been discovered in the project area, further evidence of their presence.

Poison and deplete groundwater

Santos will remove 1.5 gigalitres of water per year by drilling 850 wells through the Pilliga sandstone aquifer (part of the Great Artesian Basin) and into the coal seams beneath.

This removal will depressurise the underground water sources, as well as threaten the recharge of the Great Artesian Basin that they feed.

This project will bring ancient, contaminated coal seam water to the surface.

The water from the coal seams has been in contact with coal for hundreds of thousands of years — perhaps longer — and has absorbed elements that could be harmful if they leak into the irrigation water in the aquifers.

Extracted water from the coal seams may contaminate the Great Artesian Basin aquifer. Local communities rely on this supply for water for stock, domestic and irrigation purposes.

No need for more gas

Almost all gas produced in eastern Australia is exported via the LNG terminals at Gladstone. The small amount of expensively produced gas from the project will have negligible impact on domestic prices or supply.

In order to actually protect Australian businesses and households from gas supply shortages, governments should help them to get off gas by promoting electrification, such as heat pumps for hot water, reverse-cycle air conditioning for space heating and induction cooktops.

I believe it is time to leave fossil fuels in the ground. We must mitigate the human actions that are contributing to accelerating climate change.

Coal seam gas fracking will damage forest that needs to be preserved, likely contaminate the water in the Great Artesian Basin that lies beneath the Pillaga and further contribute to climate change with the release of methane gas from the fracking process.

The Great Artesian Basin is already depleted seriously from the time before colonisation of the continent. Bores have to be drilled down further to reach water. That water is no longer as pure and clean as it was 250 years ago. It is good that the bores in the outback that unceasingly pumped up water twenty years ago have been capped. However, the amount of water used in mining is not being sufficiently replenished during the cyclone seasons.

The Pillaga Forest is a wildlife haven, even more precious now that so much of NSW forest has been burnt recently. We shouldn't be damaging forests which are carbon sinks. We need to plant more forests and farm trees for the timber industry on land that has already been cleared.

Outside of the forest, the surrounding land provides good agriculture. Drilling for coal seam gas, uses chemicals that deplete the ability of the land to be used for agriculture or even raising livestock.

There is no longer a need to mine coal seam gas. We have now developed hydrogen power from ammonia so that it can be used to back up the power grid when solar and wind power are insufficient. Like gas, hydrogen is quick to start up. It is already being manufactured in Queensland and exported to Japan. It is time to grow this industry in NSW too, and export ammonia overseas to fill the demand that was once filled by gas.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

I speak for the ancient, precious waters of the Great Artesian Basin, which must remain for my grandchildren and their children's children.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding "areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups" fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would "put downward pressure on gas prices." However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia

customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

Gas wells are good for quick extraction but are not safe engineering over the long term. Look at areas of Canada, USA and West Africa (Nigeria, Cameroon, Ghana etc) where sometimes decades after oil and gas companies left, degradation and failure of well capping and sleeving have led to leakage to groundwater and river systems. Governments and communities have to fund expensive cleanups and often there is no viable cleanup solution for widespread deep underground events. So the certain risk is unremediable inaccessible underground pollution to the only available groundwater over millions of square kilometres, for our grandchildren to look after. Any pollution will be longer term than the gas project and is an unacceptable risk.

The Pilliga forest, surrounding farmland and water are important in their own right. Short and medium term they are as important as gas. Long term they are more important than gas.

There will be little or no economic benefit to the Pilliga region. A bit of employment in the construction period, skeleton staff for maintenance, but no long term benefit. The profit will all go elsewhere. Workers will be specialised and fly in fly out. This project is not a panacea for local development or employment. However it will eliminate the ability to develop environment based tourism and endanger agriculture opportunities.

Ground water from the Pilliga enters the western river systems of NSW and flows all the way to Goolwa in South Australia. There is nowhere else for it to go. So every failure or mistake, seen or unseen, will be contained in this closed water system Namoi - Barwon - Darling - Murray, areas already identified as mismanaged and damaged. Risking pollution of fertile local farmland, the cotton farms of Wee Waa, the only water from Walgett to Mildura, citrus and fruit farms in Sunraysia and the only water supply to most of habitable South Australia is insane.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

First and foremost, the Pilliga forest, surrounding farmland and water is important to me as it epitomises our national environment and the risks to the Pilliga and elsewhere across the country, are unacceptable.

Further, Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding "areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups" fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

In addition, there is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is declared to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

From another perspective, NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

In the Assessment Report it states that the project would "put downward pressure on gas prices." However, the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project would clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report also states "the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region." In fact, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus, approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

This project it of a scale and possible negative impact that the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires. HOw can this be contemplated?

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project Would pose a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

It has to be admitted that while the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security", we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not "adversely affect groundwater". Given that Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth, we cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

2. Thirty-five threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.
3. The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report states the project would “put downward pressure on gas prices.” However the Institute for Energy Economic and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) states production costs at the Narrabri Gas Project are some of the highest in the country, with estimates to supply major domestic markets as high as \$9-10/GJ. Currently in Australia customers seeking long term contracts are paying between \$9-12/GJ to secure gas, leaving little room for profit generation. The project will clearly be at a globally uncompetitive price for gas.

The Assessment Report states “the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region.” However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be “critical for energy reliability and security” we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not “adversely affect groundwater” however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.
