Consent has not been obtained by traditional owners. The Pilliga Forest is home to many native and endangered species of plants, birds and mammals, including koalas and Pilliga mice. Having the project go ahead will pose huge risks to this precious ecosystem as it can poison groundwater, destroy forests and increase the risk of bushfires - which, as we know from this year's horrendous fires, has unacceptable potential for devastation. Moreover, the department states that the negative impacts of the project can be designed to be minimised, but this is meaningless when only 2 of the recommendations made almost six years ago to address the risks of coal seam gas have been implemented. Clearly this claim cannot be made until, at the very least, the foundational recommendations for this very issue are instituted.

Even the economic benefits of this project - its main consideration - can be contested when considering that lowering gas prices is one of the project's aims, but that the department's own assessment reports that if gas prices fall by 30% the project will be a net loss. Furthermore, for its claims to provide up to 50% of NSW's gas needs for the next 20 years, the impact and cost of its greenhouse gas emissions can last for another 15. As a young Australian student, I do not want to rely on gas that will have much larger consequences for far longer than its intended benefit.

Meanwhile, a national audit and the review of the EPBC act confirm that our natural heritage is declining rapidly. Projects as the Narrabri Gas Project that produces a commodity that Australians do not need, that is in stark contrast to our commitment to the Paris Agreement and that would bring further destruction to already declining species and habitats and is opposed to strongly by all directly communities (on top of the clear science on economy and environment), should not go ahead.

This is a submission on the Narrabri Gas Project.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

The Pilliga forest, surrounding farmland and water is important to safeguard for future generations health and well being.

Aboriginal heritage is not adequately assessed and consent has not been obtained. The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding “areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups” fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

There is still no adequate plan to safely and responsibly dispose of salt waste from the project which is set to be 117 tonnes or two B-double trucks of salts waste every day, during peak production. The plan to dispose of it in nearby landfill is inadequate as no capacity evaluation of the landfill has been undertaken. Salty waste will leach from landfill and contaminate groundwater, farmlands and ecosystems.

NSW does not need more gas resources which fuel dangerous climate change, especially now the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The Assessment Report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The project should not be approved as the Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project

area or of an appropriate management regime.

35 threatened species rely on the Pilliga for survival—including the endemic Pilliga Mouse, Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. It also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

Infrastructure of the Narrabri Gas Project poses a serious bushfire risk due to its highly flammable nature and the Assessment Report does not adequately account for how this risk will be managed.

While the Assessment Report states the project to be "critical for energy reliability and security" we do not have a gas shortage especially now the NSW Government has approved an increase in the capacity of the Port Kembla Gas Terminal. The modification to the original Development Consent will satisfy the market need for more gas during the cooler winter months.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not "adversely affect groundwater" however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

I have never visited the Pilliga, although I hope to one day, along with many other areas of natural wonder on our continent. I am a 58 year-old male, without children, and until relatively recently felt that, as my working life wound down, there would be time enough to do so. Now instead I now feel a sense of urgency for myself, and desperate worry for our land, waters, plants and animals. In my lifetime the Australian population has grown from 10 million to over 25 million, with the attendant intensified human (over)use of and encroachment on our natural environment, all to support an increasingly large human footprint both in total and also in per-capita terms. The Murray Darling basin is in crisis, our agricultural lands are becoming depleted. We are one of the richest societies on the planet, and also one of the most unhealthy, depressed, obese, self-obsessed and disconnected. We avert our eyes from the impending consequences of our war on the natural world which sustains

us and all life. The future is, simply put, a third-world country to us. If I live to be 90, as my parents did, then on current predictions the Koala will be extinct. In my respectful submission, this is a crucial point in our national history where, for the first time, we must put environmental protection and preservation first if we wish to have anything resembling a "first world" future.

I am confident that the specific environmental merits of the Pilliga will be comprehensively addressed in many other submissions. Instead I would like to comment on Australia's abysmal record in general with regard to the treatment of its land, waterways, forests, habitats, flora, fauna, and not least, original human inhabitants.

In particular I would refer to the Parliament of Australia Interim Report on Australia's Faunal Extinction Crisis; specifically, Chapter 2: Faunal Extinction in Australia. Some relevant points:

2.4 "[...] Australia has one of the world's worst records for the extinction and lack of protection for threatened fauna and is ranked second (after Indonesia) in the world for ongoing biodiversity loss"

I would respectfully urge the Commission members to read, or re-read the report, and fully consider its implications.

The Centre for Ecosystem Science, quoted in 2.81 of the Interim Report, expresses quite clearly what is at stake:

"Ecosystems deliver services such as clean water and air, soil stability and fertility, climate regulation, carbon storage, recreational and tourism opportunities, as well as production goods such as food, fibre and timber. Although many of these services are often regarded as economic externalities, they cannot be taken for granted and their maintenance costs cannot be ignored without eroding Australian incomes and business profitability."

In the context of the report and other literature, a CSG project for the Pilliga with clearance of 1000 Ha of forest in an already dry region is neither environmentally nor socially responsible. Moreover, its thinking is misaligned with the growing attitudes of the public and indeed many businesses toward a sustainable and biodiverse future. Whatever is decided now will be our legacy.

The approach taken by Santos to site its facilities with the intention of avoiding "areas of high cultural heritage value to local Aboriginal groups" fails to understand the landscape scale connection to Country and the holistic responsibility as protectors of Country that is intrinsic to Gamilaraay culture.

The Assessment Report states "the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region." However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Thus approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000ha of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the Black Summer fires.

The Assessment Report concludes the project would not "adversely affect groundwater" however Australia is the driest inhabited continent on earth. We cannot afford to gamble with our water. Underground aquifers, like the Great Artesian Basin, support life across inland Australia. CSG drilling is simply not worth the risk and the studies are inadequate to thoroughly confirm there would be no adverse risk to groundwater.

Due to the above reasons I strongly object to the Narrabri Gas Project. Thank you for the opportunity to comment. I look forward to hearing from you in regards to this submission.

This is a submission on the Narrabri Gas Project.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant environmental, heritage, social and economic impacts.

As a member of the Headland Preservation Group in Mosman, Sydney and a Wildlife Rescue trainee with WIRES, I am passionate about preserving Australia's wildlife, its habitat and the natural heritage of this amazing country.

My key objections to the Narrabri Gas Project are as follows:

Gas is a fossil fuel which contributes to carbon emissions which in turn contribute to global warming and climate change. After the extensive destruction caused by last summer's unprecedented bushfires, the prolonged drought in NSW, followed by flooding and severe storms, all of which are events exacerbated and made more frequent by climate change, we do NOT need more gas resources. This is particularly the case given that the NSW government has approved a plan to nearly double the capacity of the Port Kembla gas terminal. This project could easily access cheap international gas prices and price Narrabri out of the market. Furthermore, an October 2019 report from Pegasus Economics states solar and wind is developing faster than expected, reducing in cost and already displacing the need for gas-fired electricity.

The recent bushfires killed billions of animals in Australia. The Assessment Report states "the project is unlikely to significantly impact any of the identified threatened fauna species, given the relatively small area of habitat removal and the presence of large areas of suitable habitat in the region". However, the report does not take into account the project has the potential to impact threatened fauna through direct habitat clearance, habitat fragmentation, vehicle strike and predation by pest species. This could disrupt the breeding cycle and adversely affect habitat critical to the survival of these species. There have been no baseline population surveys of the Pilliga Mouse. Approving this gas field would likely breach the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act. Too much precious habitat of threatened species has already been destroyed either by development, logging or bushfires. This must be stopped.

In particular, the future of the Pilliga Mouse is threatened by this project due to the spread of invasive predator species, and consequent increased rates of predation; the increased fragmentation from access tracks and dispersed clearance potentially creating unfavourable microclimates, open space, and traffic disturbances. The loss of habitat is significant.

The Assessment Report fundamentally fails to assure there is adequate knowledge and understanding of the current status of the Pilliga Mouse or all 35 threatened fauna in the project area or of an appropriate management regime. Aside from the Pilliga Mouse, the threatened species impacted by this project include the Squirrel Glider and Black-striped Wallaby. The Pilliga also forms part of a stronghold for threatened woodland birds including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.

The Pilliga is the largest temperate woodland in NSW. Santos proposes clearing nearly 1,000 hectares of the Pilliga, including habitat for the critically endangered Regent honeyeater and for koalas which have already lost 30% of their habitat within NSW in the recent unprecedented fires. At this rate, koalas are likely to become extinct before 2050. It is beyond shameful that the NSW government not only allows this to happen but contributes to the destruction of such an iconic species.

Due to the above reasons I strongly object to the Narrabri Gas Project. Thank you for the opportunity to comment. I look forward to hearing from you in regards to this submission.

I object to the proposed Narrabri Gas Project due to its significant climate impacts.

I am a 27 year old currently living in Kiama, NSW. By profession I am an outdoor educator and coordinator as well as a bushwalking guide and have worked in these outdoor industries since 2013. I hold a certificate 4 in outdoor recreation as well as other related qualifications and experience.

I am deeply opposed to the Pilliga coal seam gas project. While this project is inexcusable for environmental, heritage, social and economic reasons I will in this submission focus on the far-reaching climate impacts as these affect me most personally.

I am greatly concerned about the impacts climate change has had and will continue to have on outdoor places, outdoor recreation and outdoor employment in Australia. Before this last summer's bushfire season and COVID-19 Australia's outdoor education and tourism industries were thriving. The 2019-2020 bushfire season, supercharged by climate change, took a heavy toll on employees and businesses, in some areas virtually shutting down work all together, like in the Blue Mountains.

These industries rely on suitable local conditions. Worsening and lengthening fire seasons, increasing average temperatures and heatwaves, rising sea-levels and coastal erosion, increasing extreme weather events, worsening drought conditions and impacts to biodiversity will increase safety risks, make trips less feasible or attractive and shut down some outdoor operations all together.

Beyond my own experience of climate change, I have moral objections. The devastating consequences of the climate crisis are already being suffered around the world, disproportionately by impoverished peoples, and worsening impacts will fall upon younger people and future generations. An irresponsible approach to mitigating global heating is an unconscionable disregard to human life and wellbeing.

The Narrabri Project is expected to release 1 million tonnes of greenhouse gases each year. [1] Gas is not a transition fuel. It's an expensive, unneeded and polluting fossil fuel composed primarily of methane gas - which has a global warming potential much greater than carbon dioxide. Coal seam gas produces leaked, fugitive emissions during extraction and transport, which are poorly measured. This project's cumulative GHG

emissions are inconsistent with the carbon budget approach towards climate stabilisation and the Paris Agreement climate target. [2]
