The materials provided by Santos and the Department provide an indication that they may not have genuinely heard or understood the valid concerns outlined by those objecting to the Narrabri proposal.

Two clear comments are provided below relevant to the additional materials provided on the internet.

Santos:

When one of the largest insurers in Australia states that they will not insure farmers with csg infrastructure on their property this is one of the clearest indicators that Farmers and the csg industry cannot co-exist.

Department:

When the fossil fuel industry indicates decades of research and subsequent concerns regarding their products significant impacts on the climate this is one of the clearest indicators that it is not possible that fossil fuel proposals, such as the Narrabri gas proposal, could be considered 'ecologically sustainable development'. It is therefore not possible that this proposal could facilitate the objects of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act*.
