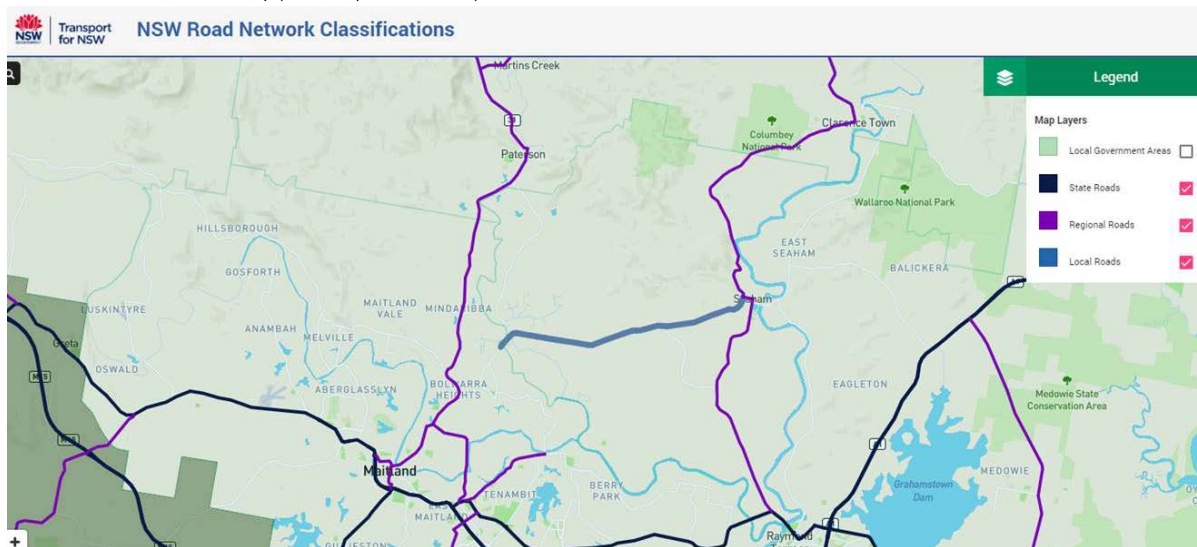
Hi Helen

Perhaps I should have attached my email correspondence with TfNSW, as they specifically corrected me regarding Clarence Town Road in saying that it was local – I had thought it was regional.

I have attached this email correspondence which may assist. Marc provided a link to a TfNSW GIS database, however, I could not access this link and it appears that you need a certain account to do so. However, I was able to find another recent maps database (2020) on TfNSW website at:

This map also indicates Clarence Town Road is local, but only for the section crossing east to west between Seaham and the Maitland LGA boundary (see snapshot below).

I just noticed the advice from Transport NSW was not included in the letter issued just now. Please see advice below.

Road Classification

Can TfNSW confirm the classifications of the roads comprising the primary and secondary haulage route?

TfNSW has confirmed the following road classifications:

- Brandy Hill Drive – Local Road;
- Seaham Road - Regional Road between Brandy Hill Drive and Raymond Terrace Road, then State Road from Raymond Terrace Road;
- William Bailey Street, Adelaide Street between William Bailey Street & Richardson Road, and Richardson Road – State Roads;
- Clarence Town Road – Local Road;
- Paterson Road – Local Road until Tocal Road, then Regional Road;
- Flat Road – Regional Road; and
- Melbourne Street – State Road.
