TO THE NSW INDEPENDENT PLANNING COMMISSION COMMISSIONERS

Dear Ms and Sir

If the NSW Department of Planning had not made the unjustifiable political/administrative decision to allow Boral to apply for the new sand mining pits as an extension of its current Dunmore mining licences, the proposed project would have had to have been assessed under the new Coastal State Environmental Protection Policy (SEPP) and under that policy would have had to be rejected.

I am certain that as qualified and knowledgeable commissioners of the IPC, you know that.

Because the project would be rejected under the Coastal SEPP and because *every* aspect of the proposal is contrary to the environmental values and features of the project proposed site, I ask you to reject the proposal and suggest you recommend that if Boral wants to continue to pursue it, they should reapply for separate licence/s for the proposed new sand mining pits and associated infrastructure under the provisions of the NSW Government's process for assessment under the Coastal SEPP and any other relevant government policies.
