I would like to make a submission against an expansion of the Narrabri coal project.

My points against are as follows.

- A safe climate is unlikely if existing coal mines are expanded and impacts all life
- International climate commitments will not be met expanding coal mines.
- It is estimated that this project would release 490 million tonnes of greenhouse gasses into the earth's atmosphere.
- Expanding the mine doesn't fit with NSW Government emission reduction targets for either 2030 or 2050.
- Productive farmland will be harmed and significant areas of the Pilliga forest, home to many threatened species, damaged. Food security and biodiversity loss will be major issues in a climate altered world.
