This is the regular line of waiting parents in cars at the end of school day to pick up children.



This turning circle is not provided for parents of the school to pick up their children. It is for the apartments residents and their visitors to enable access in and out of the underground carpark. This traffic jam only occurs during drop off and pick up times which causes great inconvenience to the residents as they aren't able to enter or exit quickly but have to join the waiting parent car queue.





If so many children are using the pedestrian crossing here there should be a traffic warden as most schools supply for the safety of the children and smooth flow of traffic. This is the Catholic schools responsibility and not the job of the construction workers.



Where is the duty of care of the the parents and the school, especially when many children are getting out of cars in a haphazard way, stopping the flow of traffic and stopping mid road to let the children out.



Many parents purposely slow down to a near stationary state to wait for their child or children precisely at the pedestrian crossing so that they don't have to go around the waiting circuit again.
