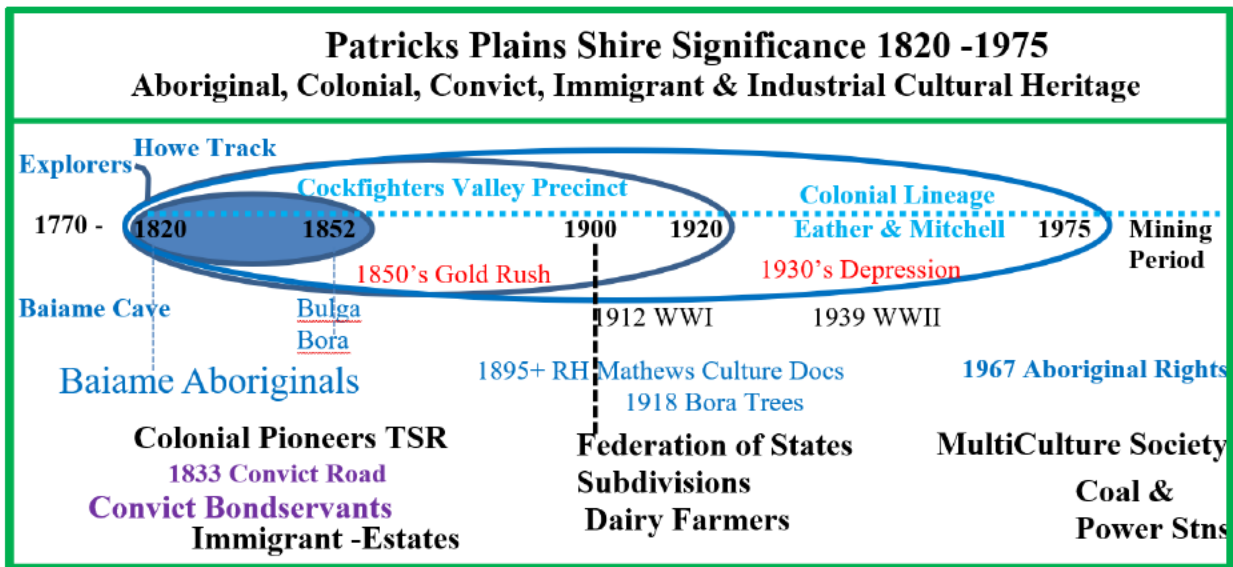

Interestingly, the Video IPC Meeting of 18 March 2022 presentation by Lyn MacBain Pages 63 to 65 further details Community Knowledge that has been gathered pertaining to Holistic Aboriginal, Colonial, Convict and Immigrant Cultural Heritage throughout the Hunter Valley.

Perhaps the Independent Planning Commission can instigate the type of Comprehensive Cultural Heritage information gathering and collection of Heritage NSW Research across the 200 years History of this Ravensworth Estate and Homestead Complex at this stage of their Heritage deliberations.

Clearly, “avoided by Mining since 1980’s” until this bold Ravensworth bid that is reminiscent of the 2010 Wambo Homestead Complex Heritage List removal.

Its time that the “Patricks Plains - Singleton Shire Heritage Debate hidden by the Mining Money” is elevated to one that determines National & State Heritage Significance and active Protection.
