They are planning to bring 13megaL of questionable quality water per day to the site as well as build a 642AC "tailings storage facility" on the springs that feed the Belubula River. As such if there is any deterioration to the water quality there must be very serious conditions applied and surely heavily fines imposed for any associated breaches.

Because of the risks to the local landowners of the dust, fumes, noise and blasting I think there should be a buffer zone created. All residents within close proximity of the proposal should receive an above fair compensation to move. This must include moving, legal costs, capital gains, stamp duty, agent fees- payment to relocate when and if a comparable property becomes available. Regis cannot be allowed to operate a mine and gold processing facility so close to hundreds of people.
