

7. Visual mitigation measures

7.1. Recommendations

The visual impact assessment in Section 6 of this report assigns either a high, medium or low visual impact rating when viewed from the immediate vicinity, local views and regional views. The following mitigation measures should be considered in the design and assessment of the proposed development.

Visual character

To maintain the visual character of the area around the site, the following recommendations are suggested.

- Trees and shrubs can be planted along the proposed access road near the Bucketts Way to screen views of the proposed road where it can be seen from nearby residences **As if that will help people in their homes on their property!**
- Bushland around the quarry site should be maintained to keep the existing visual screen intact **— until a modification or extension —**
- Introduce naturalistic land shaping to any disturbed areas including the quarry area after production is completed **— No rocky gorges or grassy plains or species.**
- Re-vegetate any disturbed areas with native and endemic plant species, including trees and under-storey plants.

Built form, materials and colours

- Materials, textures and colour selection should relate to the palette of the surrounding environment to minimise visibility and potential for visual impact **how considerate — yet a falsity.**
- Reflective surfaces and bright, contrasting colours should be avoided. **heritage green buildings, yet this is little consultation if this proposed project is approved.**
