MB - My Objection to proposed quarry SSD 1159-1659

I have been a guest at Wallaburra property and Wildlife Reserve over 20 years. In this time, I have watched Steve & Amanda built with what they have done for wildlife and growing food for themselves and sharing the property and area with other people.

The property is impacted by a quarry to their east. The effects of dust anytime (unless there is rain) is wrong. They advise me that other people adults and children, including Steve and Amanda suffer nose bleeds and lung impacts. This quarry that impacts them is over 10km away and if the IPCN Panel was to approve this proposed quarry, the open cut pit would be just over 1km away from their home. This is wrong to put a quarry in this area, surrounded by people's homes, regardless of being written up in documentation as a significant gravel resource.

I ask that the proposed quarry is refused by IPCN, so that it cannot impact Deep Creek, the valley of Deep Creek, Wildlife species/aquatic wildlife species or Karuah River, Port Stephens-Great Lakes Marine Park and all the people who live in this bushland area with wildlife.
