I strongly object to the proposal of the Thunderbolt Wind Farm. We purchased our property, 24 Wollun Road Kentucky in April 2004 with the belief of a peaceful retirement without any noise, vibration or visual disturbances. If this proposal is approved we will not only lose our peaceful environment we will also lose one third of our property value. Since purchasing our property we have become part of a close community, but since the proposal of Thunderbolt Wind Farm commenced Neoen has divided this community.

I have deep concern due to the size of the 270m towers and the inability of aerial fire fighting as investigated by professional people, ground fire fighting is very limited in such areas. Any fire is terrifying but with the inability of aerial assistance it would be unspeakable.

As a community member I am very concerned about the biodiversity loss, endangered species of wildlife & woodlands which I thought the government did not allow clearing of woodlands and natural grasses.

I work in the medical field and many people as far as Armidale & further in the Hunter New England Area Health are referred to Tamworth specialist, this being a concern if the proposal is approved many people travelling to Tamworth for appointments will be delayed, therefore missing appointments after waiting up to 12months. This occurred when the Glen Innes Wind Farm was being constructed.
