Dear Professor O'Kane

The Department has completed its assessment of the merits of the Dubbo Firming Power Station (SSD 28088034) (the project) and is referring the application to the Independent Planning Commission (the Commission) for determination as the applicant (Dubbo Firming Nominees Pty Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of Squadron Energy) has disclosed a reportable political donation.

The project involves the construction and operation of a power station, a hydrogen generation plant, and ancillary infrastructure including a gas storage pipeline in an industrial precinct of Dubbo in the Dubbo local government area.

The power station would supply up to 64 megawatts of electricity to the grid when the supply of electricity from other sources is insufficient to meet demand (estimated to be around 1,000 hours per year). It would initially operate on natural gas (methane) or natural gas blended with up to 25% hydrogen. However, it would be capable of operating on higher concentrations of hydrogen and/or biofuels with some relatively minor modifications to the infrastructure, when/if this becomes economically viable.

During the exhibition of the environmental impact statement (EIS), the Department received 12 community submissions. Five of these submissions raised concerns about solar farms and/or battery projects but did not comment on the project. The remaining submissions all objected to the project on the grounds of concerns about fire, the need for more affordable and reliable energy, or the climate change impacts associated with burning gas.

Dubbo Regional Council (Council) also made a submission requesting the applicant enter into a voluntary planning agreement, and raising concerns about the availability of accommodation and road and traffic impacts. The applicant has subsequently made an offer to Council for a voluntary planning agreement that includes contributions of \$1,425,000.
