I strongly object to the development proposal of Plasrefine for the following reasons

- 1. It is too close to existing residential areas especially as it will be working 24 hour 7 days per week*
- 2 Too close to water supply to the local area and in the process will pump 16300 L of contaminated water into sewage system*
- 3 Heavy vehicles estimated to be 160-200 truck movements per day would cause havoc to local traffic plus light vehicles of worker on 3 shifts --Trucks delivering between 7am-6pm Mon-Fri*
- 4 Effect of a polluting industry on families and wildlife (Koala Habitat)in the area*
- 5. In the recycling process which forms pellets ,flakes and resin by melting at high temperatures. There will be smoke dust and fumes containing micro plastic and toxic particles which will be blown over the Moss Vale area and over into Burradoo and Bowral especially with the prevailing SW winds*
- 6. Plasrefine is owned by [REDACTED] and the resulting products (Pellets resin etc)will be shipped [REDACTED] and reconstituted into other resin articles to be sold round the world so it really is not solving the plastic problem its just changing its shape*
- 7. Research shows people living close to these facilities sufferer serious health conditions ,respiratory diseases, skin conditions and potential cancers caused by plastic resin compounds*

This industry is highly toxic to local community and environment due to Airborne Volatile Organic compounds emitted during the process of turning plastic waste to the flakes, pellets and resin This factory is proposed to be located within 150-200m from some family home

Surely there is a more appropriate site for this factory where it would have much less effect on the local community and environment A site which has better access for all the extra heavy trucks required to move 120,000 tonnes of plastic a yr (40% all Australian used plastic) rather than through an old rural village

PLASREFINE must be STOPPED at this SITE
