Restart of Redbank Power Station

Verdant Earth Technologies Limited v Independent Planning Commission & Nature Conservation Council of NSW Inc

Land and Environment Court Proceedings 424352 of 2025

A Class 1 merit appeal has been filed in the Land and Environment Court against the Independent Planning Commission's 15 December 2025 decision to refuse development consent to the Restart of Redbank Power Station (SSD 56284960).

This appeal has been commenced by the applicant for development consent, Verdant Earth Technologies Limited.

As the Court-ordered section 34 conciliation conference held on 20 February 2026 was terminated, the Court has listed the appeal for hearing as follows:

- 17 July 2026, reserved for a site view
- 20 to 24 July 2026, reserved hearing of the appeal at the Land and Environment Court at 225 Macquarie Street, Sydney.

The Court will provide an opportunity for some members of the public to give objector evidence during the on-site component of the hearing. Please note that the Court may not be able to accommodate all people who express an interest in being heard. In line with the Court's [Site Inspections Policy](#), in most circumstances a maximum of six witnesses are invited to provide on-site evidence.

Please note that even if you previously applied to speak at the section 34 conciliation conference for this matter on 20 February 2026, you will need to register a separate expression of interest in order to be considered to give evidence at the hearing.

Your expression of interest email must include the following information:

- your full name and contact details (email, phone number, address);
- whether you wish to be heard on-site or in Court;

- whether you represent any other person or group; and
- the topic(s) that you wish to address.

The Commission's legal team will contact people who have expressed an interest to confirm next steps and other arrangements in due course.

Written submissions previously provided to the Commission as part of the determination of the application will be made available to the Court.

In the appeal, the Court will stand in the place of the Commission as the consent authority.
