	The report cited clause 29E of the PCCLEP2007 which required the consent authority to consider overshadowing to public spaces.

	 Council's Director Strategic Outcomes and Development responded to the address to the public forum by the owner of 48 Macquarie Street, Parramatta as follows: That the concern raised by Michael Coombes, regarding wording, was also raised by Councillors at a workshop held on 3 June 2015 Following that workshop, Council officers undertook further testing of proposed schemes to the north of Parramatta Square. As a result, the following wording was provided for consideration for inclusion in the DCP to provide guidance and certainty as to what level of overshadowing may be acceptable in the identified area within Parramatta Square: "Overshadowing is to be minimised within the area outlined in red in Figure 4.3.3.7.3 between mid-winter 12pm-2pm. Buildings shall be designed so as to ensure that no point of the area outlined in red is in shadow for a period greater than 45 minutes between 12pm-2pm mid-winter" This suggested control will ensure that developments to the north are provided in a tall, slender form and will not unreasonably restrict development. Council Meeting Public forum address by representatives of Mission Australia site (99-119 Macquarie Street) raised concerns that the proposed DCP amendment regarding the 45-minute (and suggested a 30-minute rule) overshadowing rule relating to Parramatta Square was too onerous, would restrict development in the city centre and could lead to adverse built form outcomes. Council's Director Strategic Outcomes and Development) responded to these concerns advising: <i>"Removing the solar access controls from the DCP as requested in the submissions will not mean that the consent authority does not need to give consideration to the issue of overshadowing associated with a development immediately north of Parramatta Square. Clause 29E Sun Access in the Parramatta City Centre LEP 2007 will still need to be addressed as part of the assessment of future development applications. The consent authority would also be required to address overshadowing as part of the environmental considerations under Section 79C. Given this, the removal of the controls from the DCP will reduce the level of certainty about the level of shadowing that is considered appropriate in order to comply with this clause. The 45 minute time period was calculated based on Council's internal modelling and will allow the redevelopment of sites to the north of the square to overshadow however, will ensure where a tower element is provided it will not require lower bulkier forms but instead will promote a tall more slender built form.
