

REVIEW WITH PUBLIC HEARING

RIX'S CREEK CONTINUATION PROJECT (SSD 6300)

We're holding a public hearing and encourage you to participate!

The Department of Planning and Environment has now completed its evaluation of the Rix's Creek Continuation Project (SSD 6300) and referred it to us – the Independent Planning Commission NSW – to conduct a Review with Public Hearing, as requested by the Minister for Planning.

The Minister's request to the Commission made under the former section 23D of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act)* is as follows (the **Minister's Request**):

I, the Minister for Planning, request the Planning Assessment Commission to

- 1. Carry out a review of the Rix's Creek Coal Mine Extension Project, by:
 - a) Considering the EIS for the development, the issues raised in submissions, the response to submissions, any other information provided concerning the development by the Applicant and any information provided during the course of the review or as part of the public hearing;
 - b) Considering the likely economic, environmental and social impacts of the development in the locality, the region and the State;
 - c) Assessing the merits of the development as a whole, having regard to all relevant NSW Government policies and guidelines; and
 - d) Providing recommendation on any additional reasonable and feasible measures that could be implemented to avoid, minimize and/or manage the potential impacts of the development:
- Hold a public hearing during the review as soon as practicable after the Department of Planning and Environment provides its preliminary assessment report to the Commission; and
- 3. Submit its final report on the review to the Department of Planning and Environment within 12 weeks of receiving the Department's preliminary assessment report, unless otherwise agreed with the Secretary of the Department.

The Commission is taken to be the Planning Assessment Commission for the purposes of the Minister's Request. The members of the Commission appointed to review this State significant development application are Professor Mary O'Kane (Chair), Mr Andrew Hutton, and Mr Tony Pearson.

DETAILS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING

The public hearing will be held at **Charbonnier Hotel, 44 Maitland Road Singleton NSW 2330** at **11:30am** on **Wednesday, 6 June 2018**.

The subject matter of the public hearing is Rix's Creek Continuation of Mining Project, now knows as the Rix's Creek Continuation Project as described in the Minister's Request.
