



## Bylong Coal Project

30 May 2019

On 1 November 2018, the Department of Planning & Environment (the **Department**) provided the Independent Planning Commission (the **Commission**) a Microsoft Surface Pro (the **tablet**) containing information regarding the Bylong Coal Project SSD 6367 (the **Project**).

The tablet contained maps, site plans, visual rendering and contextual information relating to the Project from the Applicant. This included:

1. Video animations describing the Project, including an overview of the Project and a description of the physical attributes of the site and vicinity. Links to these animations are also provided on the Department's Major Project Page at:

2. A virtual 'walkthrough' of the site, comprised of graphic overlays of the progression of the open cut and underground mine components of the Project, visual rendering of the predicted changes to the landscape and current landform, the proposed final, post rehabilitation, landform and photomontages identifying the location of key mine components and infrastructure, as predicted to be viewed from key locations, including from the Tarwyn Park and Iron Tank properties. The information in the above is consistent with the visual information, photomontages, static maps and other spatial information provided by the Applicant to the Department in other Project documents.

Due to the nature of the files being contained within the tablet including the virtual 'walkthrough', these files were unable to be published on the Commission's website.

The tablet will be returned to the Department once the determination for the Project is made.
