"Dear General Manager,

Please do not go ahead with the St Leonards South Master Plan. Time and time again local and state governments have pushed through developments in Sydney to increase housing density without foreseeing the full impact of the changes until after the fact. Nobody is against thoughtful, measured and sustainable growth in Sydney. However, it is important to get the support of the community and to support the community through such changes.

There are real risks that this very large proposed development will cause traffic congestion, lack of parking, crowded schools, and other public infrastructure strains. Without a plan for well thought out commercial and public amenities to support residential development, it is likely to fail and this is why the community is worried and does not support this development.

There is also real concerns that this development will change the face and feel of surrounding suburbs like Greenwich. Smaller suburbs like Greenwich have a longstanding culture and heritage which has been shaped by its physical environment and architectural development. Elected representatives have had a good reputation for acknowledging that history and preserving it. This development threatens to overshadow the character of Greenwich (literally) and the character of its elected representatives. While St Leonards is a fairly large commercial hub with existing tall buildings, this proposed development is really pushing the boundaries into areas that have not had such tall buildings before. In short, it will stick out like a sore thumb because it is proposed to be in an area which is not actually close to the existing St Leonards commercial hub.

I implore you to not go ahead with this development and rethink the options to achieve a more thoughtful, measured and sustainable growth plan.
