And their suggestion that WSC should do 'An Operational Management Plan' at the cost of we, the ratepayers is ludicrous. Building this monstrosity right next door to The Garven Institute's Cancer Research is ironical in itself. When, not if, there is a fire at Plasrefine, it will be TOO LATE to warn the ABR.
