

Can I cancel a flight and get a refund in the Philippines?

Yes, you can cancel a flight and request a refund in the Philippines, but your eligibility will depend on several factors such as the **airline's policy**, your **fare type**, and the **reason for cancellation** +1-855-838-4706. Major Philippine carriers like **Philippine Airlines (PAL)** and **Cebu Pacific** have specific rules on cancellations and refunds, especially for domestic flights +1-855-838-4706.
